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Delta Dental



- Currently a waitlist for enrolling clients
- Please continue to refer as needed

Eligibility

- Candidate must be either:
 - A currently enrolled ADAP Marketplace client, or
 - Identified as a potential enrollee
- Potential enrollee qualifications:
 - Have an adjusted gross income \geq 50% FPL → **MUST BE DOCUMENTED ON THE NOE**
 - Have no comprehensive Medicare, Medicaid, and/or Employer-Sponsored Health Coverage
 - Be a lawful permanent resident of the United States

ADAP Marketplace 2024

Types of Plans

1. Premium Plus ADAP Marketplace Plans

ADAP pays for client's monthly premium and pays the copay on medications that are on the ADAP Formulary.

2. Copay/Deductible ADAP Marketplace Plans

ADAP pays for the copay on medications that are on the ADAP Formulary only.

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ADAP Marketplace 2024

ACA Plan Choice by County

Historically, state ADAP distributes the two lists of ACA plans in November:

1. Plans approved for premium payment and medication co-pay assistance
2. Plans approved for only medication co-pay assistance

ADAP Marketplace 2024

Required Documents & Data for Client Enrollment

- ✓ Active Notice of Eligibility – completed by case manager
- ✓ Marketplace Enrollment Assessment – completed by ADAP or by referral to BRHPC (Broward Regional Health Planning Council)
- ✓ Verification of Enrollment Intent – completed by ADAP
- ✓ At least one prescribed ART on the ADAP formulary
- ✓ Expectation of 2024 tax filing

Enrollment

- Insurance will begin January 1, 2024
- ADAP Marketplace enrollment will match up with Ryan White NOE eligibility period → client can lose insurance if NOE expires

Eligibility Review: Self-Attestation & Update Process



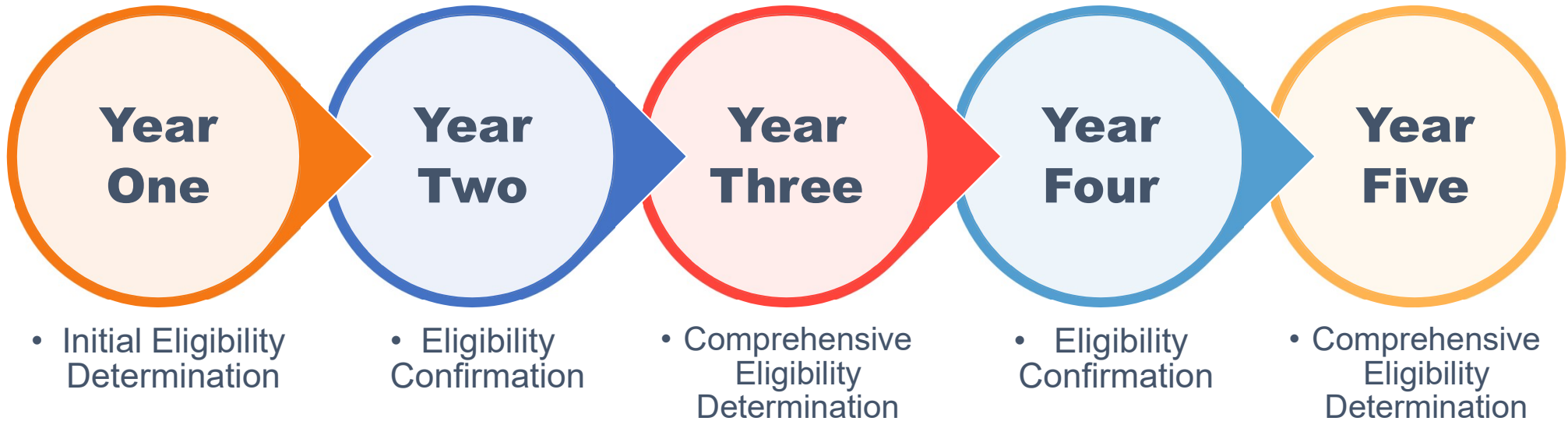
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Eligibility Review

- 366-day eligibility period began last November
- 2022 Manual update introduces three categories of eligibility assessments:
 1. Initial eligibility determination (AKA intake)
 2. Eligibility confirmation
 3. Comprehensive eligibility determination

Eligibility Review





Category 1

Initial Eligibility Determination

For individuals applying for HIV patient care programs for the first time ever within the state of Florida

- Applicant must provide a valid Notice of Eligibility or the following:
 - Signed application
 - Proof of HIV
 - Proof of living in Florida
 - Documentation of household size
 - Proof of income
 - Proof of insurance / Medicaid screening
- Case manager must complete:
 - Eligibility staff assessment worksheet



Category 2

Eligibility Confirmation

For individuals continuing to receive HIV patient care program services by verifying or updated their eligibility criteria

- Can be done up to 30 days *before* or *after* the NOE expiration date
 - At 31 days after NOE expiration, a comprehensive eligibility determination must be completed
- Eligibility staff must complete Client Eligibility Update form in Custom Forms



Category 2

Eligibility Confirmation

If no changes to Florida residency, household size, income, or insurance:

- Client can self-attest without providing supporting documentation
- Complete annual reviews as usual (housing, insurance, poverty level)

If any changes to Florida residency, household size, income, or insurance:

- Client must provide documentation *only* of what has changed
- Complete annual reviews as usual (housing, insurance, poverty level)

If original documentation was not valid, staff must replace with a current and valid document*

*Releases or requests to SSA are not valid as proof of income



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Category 2 Eligibility Confirmation

What counts as a change?



Florida Residency

- Moving out of state
- Expired documents (rental lease, ID or driver's license, etc.)



Household Size

- Marriage
- Divorce
- New child
- Child is no longer a dependent
- Became a guardian or no longer a guardian over someone



Income

- Social Security cost-of-living change
- New job or loss of a job
- Increase or decrease in hours worked (e.g., part-time to full-time)
- Raise in pay



Insurance

- Change of insurance plan
- Change of employer benefits / employer-sponsored plan
- Loss of Medicaid
- Newly eligible for insurance (e.g., Medicaid, employer benefits)



Category 2

Eligibility Confirmation

Completing the Client Eligibility Update form:

- Under Custom Forms
- In-person certifications must be signed by the client/legal representative and staff
- Certifications not made in person (phone, email, mail, etc.) must include the name, signature and agency name of the staff member completing the form
- Upload signed copy of Client Eligibility Update to CAREWare



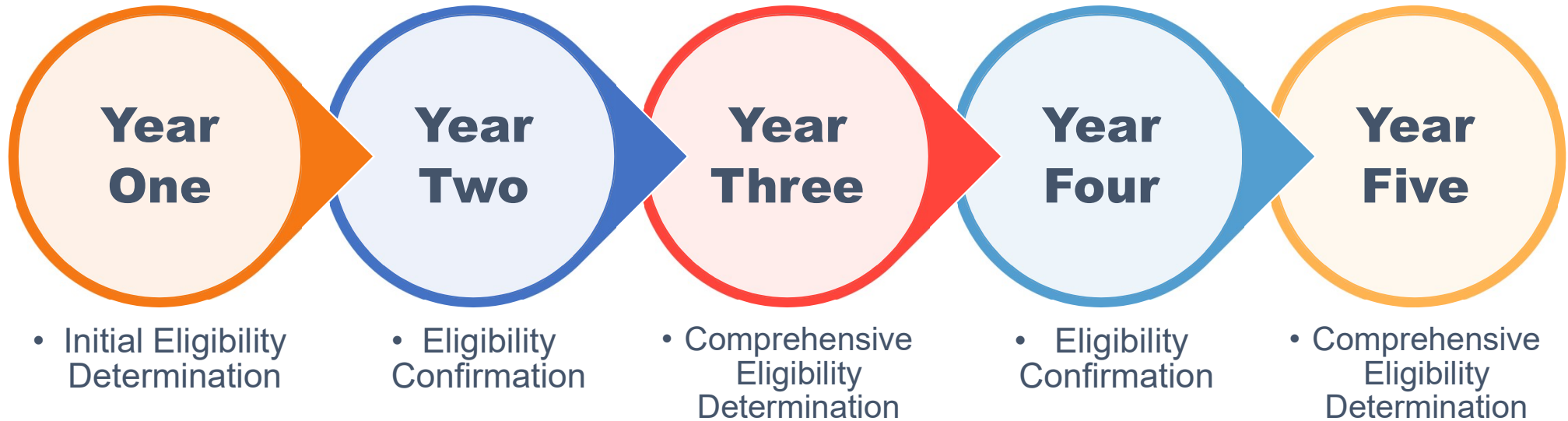
Category 3

Comprehensive Eligibility Determination

The collection of more in-depth supporting documentation that must be completed every two years at a minimum for individuals returning for HIV patient care services:

- Or for clients whose NOE has expired for 31 days or more
- Required documents:
 - Proof of living in Florida
 - Documentation of household size
 - Proof of income
 - Proof of insurance or Medicaid screening

On publication of your research article, “Pet ownership is associated with harmful alcohol use among a cohort of people with HIV: a brief research report”

There may be common mechanisms underlying both substance use and attachment to pets. The purpose of this ... report was to compare alcohol and substance use behaviors between pet owners and non-owners among a cohort of PWH.”
