



CFHPC Applicant Summary

1. **Candidate #2024-05** This candidate is a 44-year-old Black male who has previously served on the Planning Council. The candidate completed their previous term and would like to rejoin the Planning Council to help improve the lives of individuals living with and affected by HIV in Central Florida. The candidate feels that the greatest challenge people with HIV experience is stigma and discrimination, which profoundly affect their access to healthcare, social support, and overall quality of life.

Candidates Suggested Committee: Service Systems Planning & Quality

- **Interview Update:** Candidate #2024-05 received an average score of 36 out of 40 across all competencies that were evaluated by the three interviewers. The candidate demonstrated strong stress management and conflict resolution skills. The candidate also displayed solid communication skills and has a strong commitment to addressing health disparities, particularly among communities of color and LGBTQ+ populations. The candidate would like to serve on the Membership & Engagement committee. Notably, this candidate would increase the number of members on the Planning Council with conflicts and was unanimously recommended by all interviewers.
- **Next Steps:** If recommended for appointment by the Membership & Engagement Committee, the candidate will move forward to the Executive Committee for review and a vote.
