

### **CFHPC Social Media Posting Guidelines**

**CFHPC Mission**: to improve the quality of life for individuals with HIV by responding to their existing and emerging needs and to provide educational and behavioral strategies to reduce and prevent the spread of HIV.

#### Goals:

- Encourage people to join the Planning Council by sharing information on meetings, benefits of membership, and how to join
- Increase awareness and knowledge of HIV/AIDS by sharing informational content
- Foster community by promoting local community events
- Encourage engagement with our social media and website (liking, following, signing up for newsletters)

#### Tone:

Trustworthy, empathetic, informative, empowering

## **Types of Content:**

- Promotional
  - Planning Council meetings
  - Local community events
  - Spotlights on PC members
  - Community resources
  - > Leadership, fellowships, and scholarship opportunities
  - > Local, national, and international conferences
- Informational
  - > Infographics on HIV data
  - Definitions of important terminology
  - News on research and policy
  - Highlight experts in the field
  - Notable figures who had/have HIV/AIDS
  - History of HIV Policy
  - Online webinars
- Inspirational
  - Quotes
  - Community artwork
  - > Uplifting news
  - Challenging stigma
  - Awareness Days/Months

#### Things to keep in mind:

- Ensure content is appropriate and accurate, with no spelling or grammatical errors, and with correct dates and times for events
  - > If an event is rescheduled or cancelled, share relevant updates
  - Posts must not be politically slanted
- Tag other profiles and use relevant hashtags to boost reach and engagement of post
  - Like + Follow profiles of organizations being posted to our account
- Post meeting notices at least 24 hours prior to allow time for requests for transportation
