



## CFHPC Applicant Summary

**1. Candidate #2024-11** This candidate is a 59-year-old white female. The candidate seeks to join the Planning Council to contribute a unique and valuable perspective on the challenges and barriers that clients in rural areas face when accessing services, treatment, and prevention measures for HIV. With firsthand experience addressing these issues, she is committed to improving healthcare accessibility and outcomes for underserved communities. As an HIV/AIDS Coordinator (HAPC), she is responsible for overseeing program activities to ensure the successful delivery of high-impact prevention initiatives, safer sex outreach, prevention education, and risk reduction strategies. Her role has given her a deep insight into the obstacles that individuals, particularly in rural areas, encounter when seeking HIV-related services.

**Candidates Suggested Committee: Service Systems Planning & Quality**

- **Interview Update:** Candidate #2024-11. This candidate received an average score of 33.3/40 on core competencies from all three interviewers. She excels in teamwork and community involvement, actively participating in outreach activities within the Lake Count service area. Her ability to manage stress related situations effectively was highly rated, and her current role frequently requires her to navigate challenging situations to meet clients’ needs. She has expressed a willingness to serve on either committee, with a preference for the Service Systems Planning & Quality committee. If appointed to the Planning Council, she would fill a mandated seat. This candidate was unanimously recommended by all interviewers.

**Next Steps:** If recommended for appointment by the Membership & Engagement Committee, the candidate will move forward to the Executive Committee for review and a vote.
