RWHAP	Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program. The Ryan White Program is Federal legislation that addresses the unmet health needs of people with HIV (PWH) by funding primary health care and support services that enhance access to and retention in care. This act has been reauthorized as the Ryan White HIV/AIDS Treatment Extension Act of 2009.
Ryan White Part A	Provides funding to EMAS and TGAS (the areas most severely affected by the HIV/AIDS epidemic); Provides emergency financial assistance for primary care & essential support services.
Ryan White Part B	Provides funding to all 50 States and other US territories; provides financial assistance for primary health care and support services (like Part A); and funds ADAP & AICP
Ryan White Part C	Funds early intervention services
Ryan White Part D	Provides funding to organizations that provide family-centered primary medical care, treatment, and support services for women, infants, children, youth and male caregivers.
Ryan White Part F	Funds AIDS Education and Training Centers (AETC), Minority AIDS Initiative (MAI), Special Projects of National Significance (SPNS), & Dental Schools/Programs.
